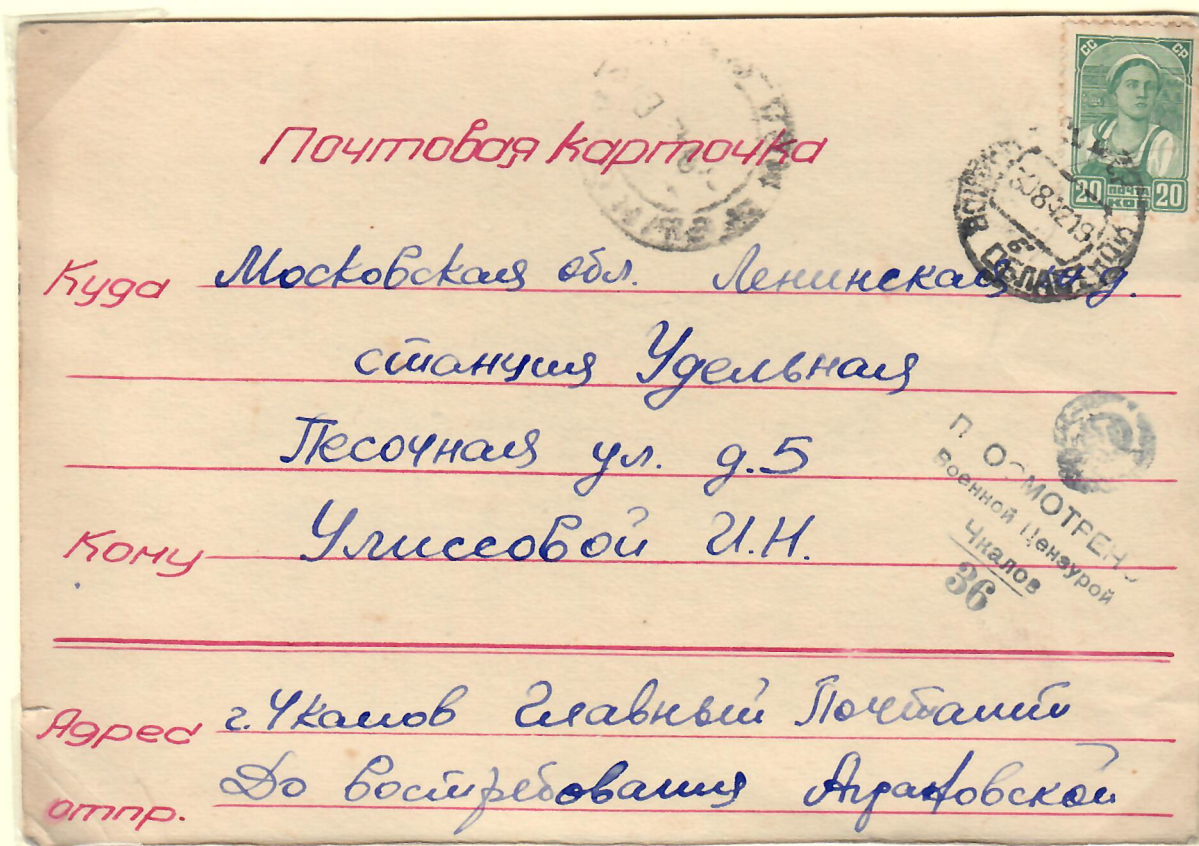


1.4 Censor at oblast/krai in Asian USSR

Chkalov
1st and 2nd Period



Chkalov, Russian republic, dated 4.11.1941 to Leningrad, Russian republic, censored in Chkalov, 1st period.
Usage is November 1941 to August 1942, with 3 numbers in the range 12 to 35.



Chkalov, Russian republic 30.8.1942 to Moscow oblast, Russian republic, censored in Ufa, 2nd period.
Usage is August 1942 to July 1943, with 26 numbers in the range 4 to 248.

1.4 Censor at oblast/krai in Asian USSR

Ufa
1st and 2nd Period



Ufa, Russian republic 30.3.1942 to Kaluga, Russian republic, censored in Ufa, 1st period.
It is two different cancel types, usage is October 1941 to March 1942, with 10 numbers in the range 050 to 700.
All cancels from Ufa in this period ends with a zero, so the range is in fact 05 to 70 with a zero at the end.



Ufa, Russian republic 26.9.1942 to Urgentch, Uzbek republic, censored in Ufa, 2nd period.
It is seven different cancel types, usage is April 1942 to June 1943, with 18 numbers in the range 15 to 180.

Sverdlovsk
1st Period



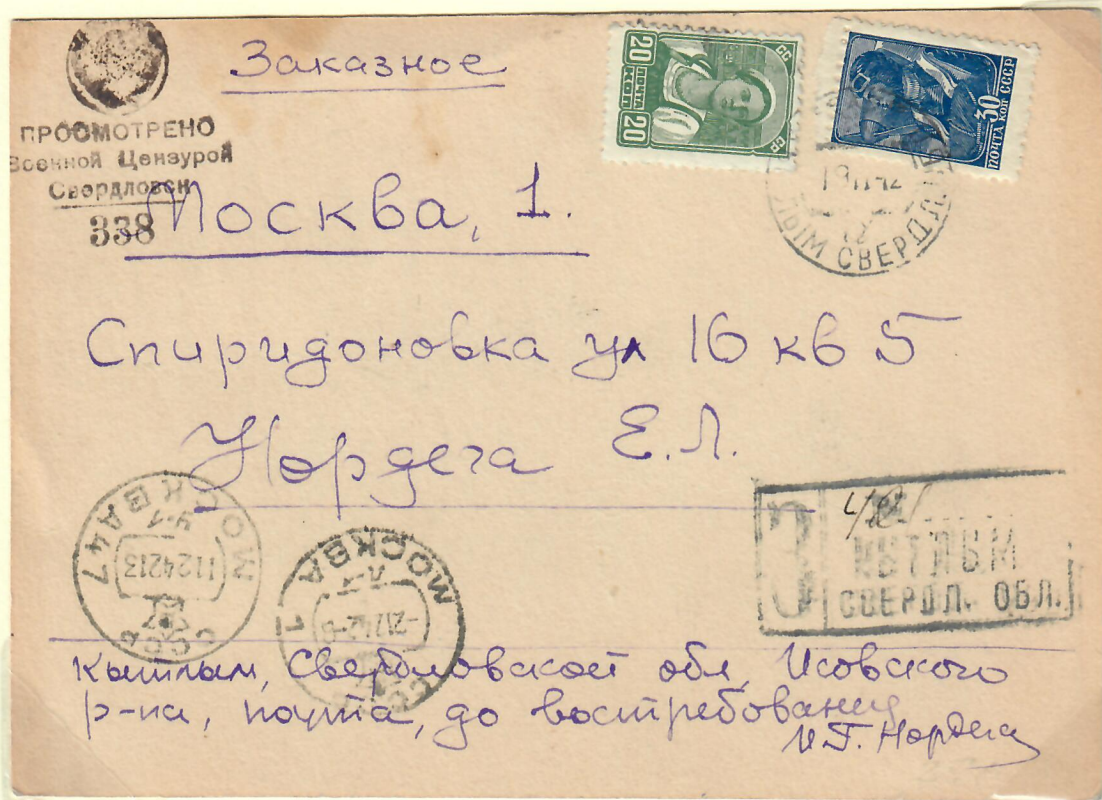
Sverdlovsk, Russian republic 2.9.1941 to Mariupol, Ukrainian republic, censored in Sverdlovsk, 1st period. Usage is August to October 1941, with 3 numbers in the range 2 to 16. The number is between the coat of arms and the wavy lines. The registration of the numbers is very difficult due to very small and unclear numbers.



The airmail route.



Airmail, Sverdlovsk, Russian republic 27.12.1941 to Moscow, censored in Sverdlovsk, 1st period. Usage is October 1941 to February 1942, with 17 numbers in the range 4 to 172. Airmail postage for postcard is 60 kop. (1st Sep. 1940 – 15th Sep. 1948). Airmail route is Sverdlovsk - Moscow. Airmail during the war is very rare.



Registered, Sverdlovsk, Russian republic 19.11.1942 to Moscow, Russian republic, censored in Sverdlovsk, 2nd period. Usage is March 1942 to June 1943, with 81 numbers in the range 4 to 373. Note the similarity of the censor cancel to the regular cancel used in the 1st period.



Sverdlovsk, Russian republic 13.7.1943 to Molotov, censored in Sverdlovsk, 3rd period.

Usage is July 1943 to December 1945, with:

15 numbers in the range 12956 to 13040, 4 numbers in the range 13372 to 13434,

4 numbers in the range 14002 to 14033, and 4 numbers in the range 14154 to 14195

Numbers beginning with 130XX, 140XX, and 141XX belongs to Sverdlovsk. This has not been recorded in any literature.

1.4 Censor at oblast/krai in Asian USSR

Chelyabinsk
1st and 2nd Period



Magnitogorsk, Russian republic 10.2.1942 to Belomorsk, Karelo-Finnish republic, censored in Chelyabinsk, 1st period. Usage is November 1941 to March 1942, with 13 numbers in the range 3 to 58. The similarities of these two cancels here were an important step to identify and systemize the regular cancels from the first period in regard to form and size. Such as text length, state emblem, and shifted text.



Chelyabinsk oblast, Russian republic unclear date 3.1942 to Kalinin oblast, Russian republic, censored in Chelyabinsk, 2nd period. It is four different cancel types, usage is March 1942 to July 1943, with 31 numbers in the range 5 to 593. These notification stationaries are franked with 30 kopek but used as postcards which were 20 kopek postage.

1.4 Censor at oblast/krai in Asian USSR

Kurgan and Omsk
3rd and 1st Period



Kurgan obl., Russian republic dated 18.6.1943 to Leningrad (arrival 3.8.1943), Russian republic, censored in Kurgan, 3rd period. Usage recorded is June 1943 to December 1943, with 3 numbers in the range 17682 to 17695. Numbers with 176XX belongs to Kurgan. This has not been recorded in any literature. Kurgan became a separate oblast after a decree on 6th February 1943, no censorship in Kurgan before this date.

The airmail route.

Registered airmail, Omsk, Russian republic, 28.9.1941 to Moscow, Russian republic, censored in Omsk, 1st period. Usage is September to October 1941. A very short usage period and rare censor cancel. Postage is 1 Rubel, which is correct internal airmail rate in the period 1.9.1940 to 15.9.1948 (no difference for registered/un-registered). It was transported on the Trans-Siberian air route. Airmail during the war is very rare.

Usage is November 1941 to February 1942, with 5 numbers in the range 1 to 44.
Notification stationary is franked with 30 kopek but used as postcard which was 20 kopek postage.

Omsk oblast, Russian republic, 7.9.1943 to Leningrad, Russian republic, censored in Omsk, 3rd period.
Usage is September 1943 to June 1945, with:
4 numbers in the range 02611 to 02636, and 5 numbers in the range 04125 to 04143.
Numbers with 026XX and 041XX belongs to Omsk. This has not been recorded in any literature
Stationary is franked with 30 kopek but used as postcard which was 20 kop. postage.

Novosibirsk
1st and 2nd Period



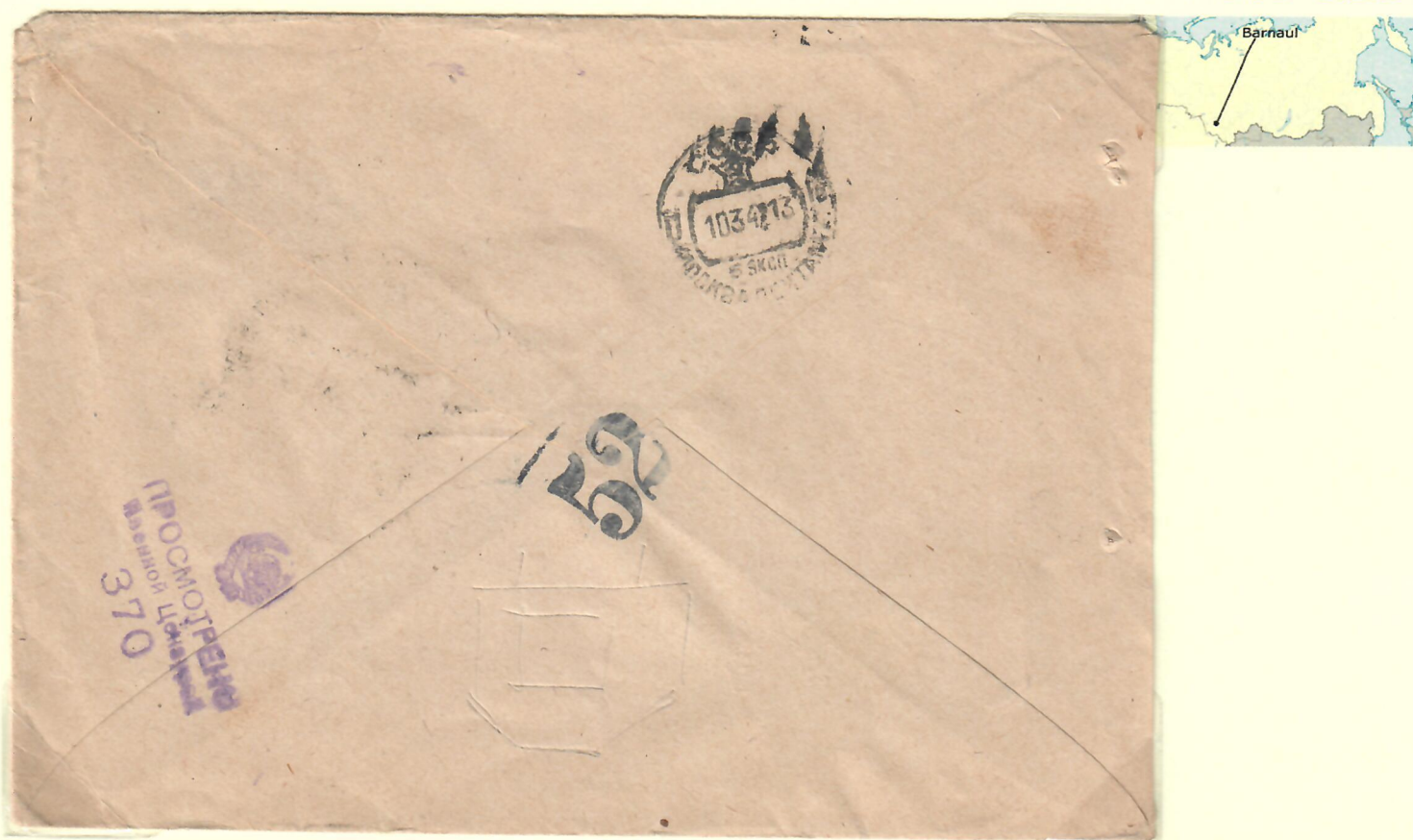
Tomsk, Russian republic 7.11.1941 to Moscow, Russian republic, censored in Novosibirsk, 1st period.
Usage is September 1941 to March 1942, with additional numeric cancel (82)(censor id) with circle. The other numeric cancel (101) is used in Moscow.



Unclear place and date 1943 to Kemerovsk oblast, Russian republic, censored in Novosibirsk, 2nd period.
It is two different cancel types, usage is April 1942 to October 1943, with 34 numbers in the range 3 to 337.

1.4 Censor at oblast/krai in Asian USSR

Barnaul
1st and 2nd Period



Bisk, Altaisky krai, Russian republic 26.2.1942 to Moscow, Russian republic, censored in Barnaul, 1st period. Usage is November 1941 to February 1942, with 3 numbers in the range 302 to 370. The number 52 is applied in Moscow.



Barnaul, Russian republic 2.6.1943 to Yaroslavl oblast, Russian republic, censored in Barnaul, 2nd period. Usage is October 1942 to June 1943, with 9 numbers in the range 3 to 150, and one single number 315. The triangular cancel is a postage free cancel for soldiers.

Krasnoyarsk
2nd and 3rd Period



The airmail route.

Krasnoyarsk, Russian republic 17.2.1943 to Moscow, Russian republic, censored in Krasnoyarsk, 2nd period. It is three different cancel types, usage is April 1942 to October 1943, with 34 numbers in the range 2 to 192. Airmail letter USSR 1 Rubel (1st Sep. 1940 – 15th Sep. 1948). Carried aboard the air route from Irkutsk – Moscow on the Trans-Siberian air route. All airmail during the war is scarce.



Krasnoyarsk, Russian republic, 22.11.1944 to Tatarskaya ASSR, censored in Krasnoyarsk, 3rd period. Usage is April 1944 to July 1944, with 3 numbers in the range 08574 to 08576. Numbers with 085XX belongs to Krasnoyarsk. This has not been recorded in any literature. Sent from soldier at evacuation hospital 985, therefore postage free as field post.

1.4 Censor at oblast/krai in Asian USSR

Irkutsk
2nd and 3rd Period



Registered, Irkutsk, Russian republic 24.5.1943 to Akmolinsk oblast, Kazakstan SSR, censored in Irkutsk, 2nd period.
Usage is November 1942 to July 1943, with 12 numbers in the range 7 to 92.
Postage is correct (20 kopek (postcard USSR) + 30 kopek (registered USSR)).



Irkutsk, Russian republic, 19.2.1944 to Kiev, Ukrainian republic, censored in Irkutsk, 3rd period.
Usage is October 1943 to December 1944, with 5 numbers in the range 18436 to 18460.
Numbers with 184XX belongs to Irkutsk. This has not been recorded in any literature.

1.4 Censor at oblast/krai in Asian USSR

Ulan-Ude
2nd and 3rd Period



Registered, Ulan-Ude, Russian republic 24.5.1943 to Moscow, Russian republic, censored in Ulan-Ude, 2nd period. It is three different cancel types, usage is May 1942 to June 1943, with 14 numbers in the range 3 to 65 and the single number 343. Postage is correct (20 kopek (postcard USSR) + 30 kopek (registered USSR)).

Ulan-Ude - Irkutsk



Tsipikan, BM ASSR, 10.11.1944 to Zaporozhe, Ukrainian republic, censored in Ulan-Ude, 3rd period.

It is two different cancel types, usage is Autumn 1943 to November 1944, and starting the censor number with 032XX.

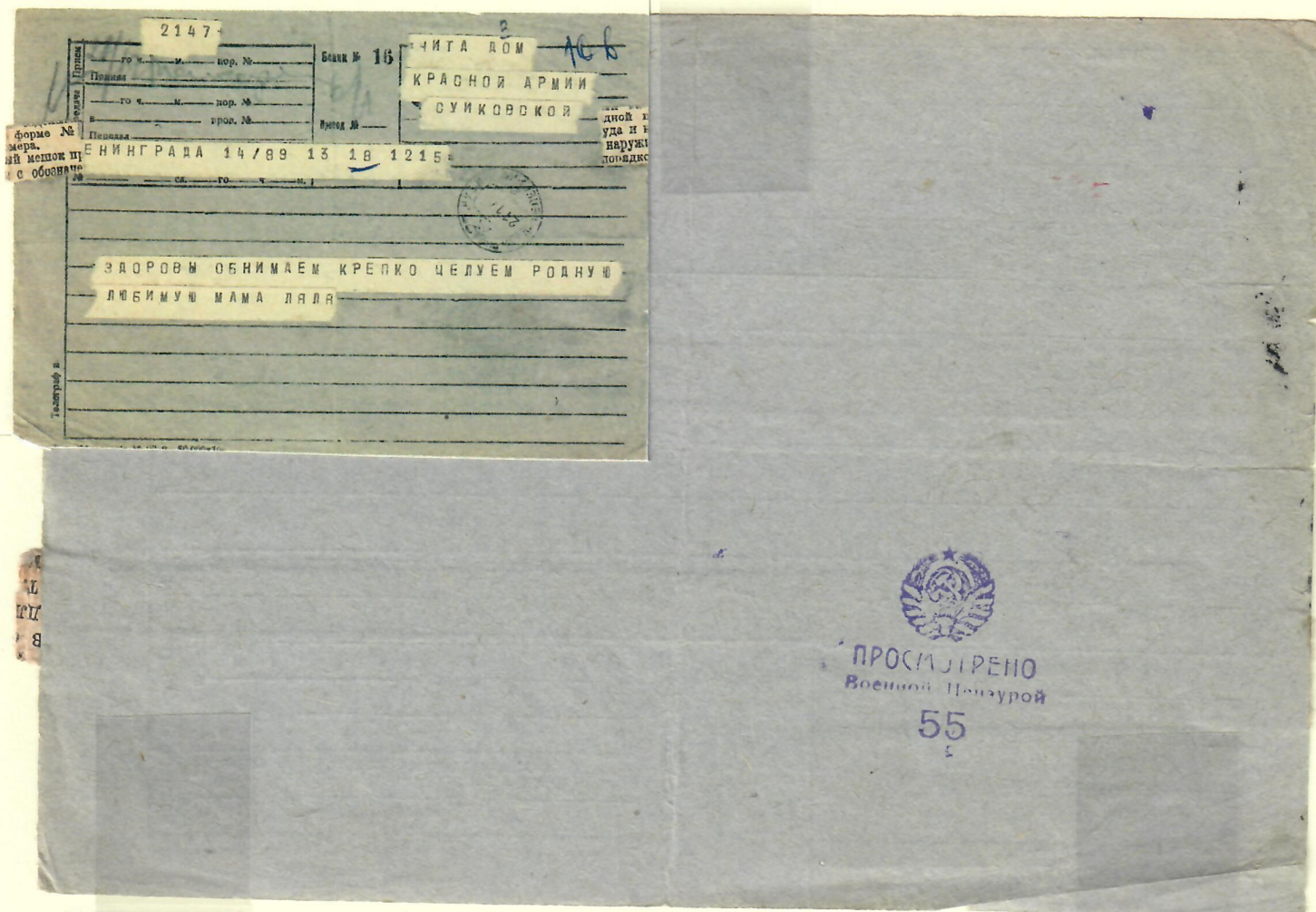
This has not been recorded in any literature.

Airmail postage for postcard is 60 kop. (1st Sep. 1940 – 15th Sep. 1948). By land Tsipikan to Ulan-Ude, then airmail route Ulan-Ude - Irkutsk, Irkutsk - Moscow, then Moscow – Kharkov - Dnepropetrovsk, afterwards by land to Zaporozhe.

Airmail during the war is very rare.

Chita
1st and 2nd Period



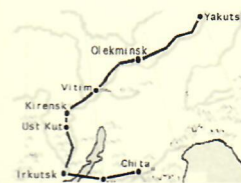
Telegram, Leningrad, Russian republic 21.1.1942 to Chita, Russian republic, censored in Chita, 1st period. Usage is January 1942, with just one number recorded.



Chita oblast, Russian republic, 28.2.1943 to Kalinin oblast, Russian republic, censored in Chita, 2nd period. Usage is August 1942 to July 1943, with 3 numbers in the range 24 to 75.

Yakutsk and Magadan 3rd and 2nd Period

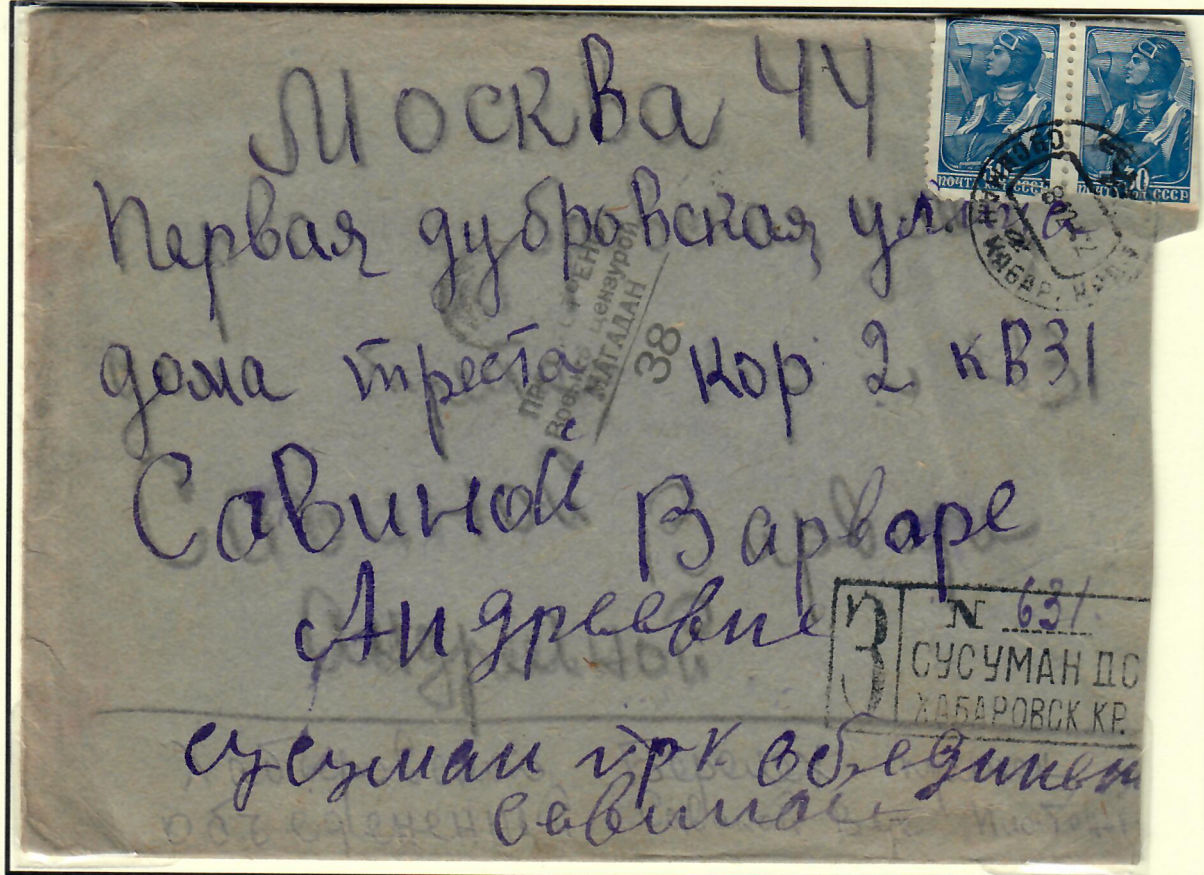


The airmail route.
Yakutsk - Irkutsk



Airmail, Yakutsk, Russian republic 4.1.1944 to Leningrad, Russian republic, censored in Yakutsk, 3rd period. Usage is January 1944, with only one registered number.

Airmail postage for letter is 1 rub. (1st Sep. 1940 – 15th Sep. 1948). Airmail route is Yakutsk – Irkutsk, Irkutsk – Moscow, Moscow - Leningrad. Arrival cancel in Leningrad 2.2.1944, the Leningrad blockade ended 27.1.1944 (while letter was in transit). In 1939 only 52 000 people lived in the city. Airmail during the war is very rare, and this northern airmail route is unique by itself.



Susuman, Khabarovsk krai, Russian republic 8.12.1942 to Moscow, Russian republic, censored in Magadan, 2nd period.

Arrival in Moscow 10.7.1943, almost seven months later. The cutting on the right side is from the censors scissor.

Usage is December 1942 to spring 1945, with 4 numbers in the range 4 to 38.

This is a very rare censor mark. Magadan is very isolated, and the nearest major town by road is Yakutsk 2000 km away. Magadan was the administrative center for the Gulag organization Dalstro and got its town status in 1939. The climate of Magadan is subarctic.

1.4 Censor at oblast/krai in Asian USSR

Vladivostok
1st and 2nd Period



Registered, Vladivostok, Russian republic 14.12.1941 to Leningrad, Russian republic, censored in Vladivostok, 1st period.
Usage is December 1941, with just one number registered.
Postage for registered letter USSR is 60 kopek (30 kopek (postcard USSR) + 30 kopek (registered USSR)),
franked with 120 kopek.



Vladivostok, Russian republic, 4.4.1942 to Molotov oblast, Russian republic, censored in Vladivostok, 2nd period.
It is two different cancel types (Vladivostok above/below the number), usage is April 1942 to July 1943, with 12
numbers in the range 2 to 168.

1.4 Censor at oblast/krai in Asian USSR

Khabarovsk
2nd and 3rd Period



Uncancelled card, 1943 to Leningrad, Russian republic, censored in Khabarovsk, 2nd period.
Usage is December 1942 to March 1943, with 11 numbers in the two ranges 4 to 34 and 117 to 198.



Khabarovsk, Russian republic ?..7.1943 to Moscow, Russian republic, censored in Khabarovsk, 3rd period.
Usage is July 1943 to August 1945, with 2 numbers in the range 15813 to 15836.
