A soldier with some packages outside the field post office on the Eastern front. The postcard is marked with Feldpost 683, and indicating that it is the field post office 683 attached to the 18<sup>th</sup> Landwehr division located east of Posnan at the actual time. Field post office 683 was established on 15<sup>th</sup> February 1917, so the picture is taken some during the summer of 1917 (the unit was transferred to Western front at the end of the war).

The German emperor Wilhelm II with his general staff outside the imperial German field post station (Feldpostexpedition) in Galicia (The 11<sup>th</sup> Army) on the 22<sup>nd</sup> April 1915. The 11<sup>th</sup> Army was on the Western front initially but moved to the Eastern front in November 1914 until the end of the war. The 11<sup>th</sup> Army started the Gorlice—Tarnów offensive on the 1<sup>st</sup> May 1915 Postcard is unused.

Feldpoststation 239 located in Kruševac (Крушевац), Serbia. Postcard is sent with the field post in April 1916.

Field post from the Balkan area is rare, and this postcard identifies Feldpoststation 239 with the location name on the wall of the building.

Card has the text "Today we are together with the gentlemen of the field post 844 for the last time; going to Soly tomorrow." Described and sent as field post from the 46<sup>th</sup> Landwehr Division (Field Post 728), which arose from the 3<sup>rd</sup> Reserve Division (Field Post 844). Soly is located in Belarus.




Soldiers outside the field post office damaged by artillery fire, most likely on the Western front. This is the only picture of a destroyed field post station.
