Naval post station 1101, 13.6.1942 to Molotov oblast, Russian republic, censored at naval base Kronstadt, 1^{st} period. Naval post station 1101 belongs to Red Army Baltic Fleet (Kronstadt) outside Leningrad. It is two different types (letters KB Φ or B), usage October 1942 to May 1943 for the B variant, with 22 numbers in the range 5 to 54. In October 1942 the letters K and Φ was removed from the cancel.




Naval post station, 2.9.1943 to Irkutsk oblast censored at BMΠΕ ΚΕΦ (Kronstadt, Leningrad), 3rd period. ΠΠΗ 51426 is 72nd Infantry Division, formed from the 7th Brigade Naval Infantry in the Baltic Fleet (Kronstadt, Leningrad). It is canceled with the mute naval post cancel used by BMΠC #1158 (located in Kronstadt, Leningrad). This is the only censor cancel usage from the 3rd period, identified as belonging to the navy.

An interesting fact is that in October 1942 the naval post station was renamed to field post station with the same numbers, so this cancel should not exist. Anyway, it was made mute with all the other field post station cancels after the field post reorganization the 6th February 1943.



Registered naval post station 1007, 7.4.1942 to Gorky censored at BMIIC #1007 (Sevastopol, Black Sea Fleet), 1st period. Naval post station 1007 belongs to Black Sea Fleet stationed in Sevastopol. Usage is August 1941 to April 1942. Registered naval post is very rare and this is a unique item.



Field post station 1133, 7.2.1943 to Black See Fleet, Russian republic, censored at BMIIC #1007 (Sevastopol), 2nd period. Marked at front, "returned because of no full address". Sender's address is 1131, all these field/naval postal stations belongs to the Black See Fleet. Content of the letter is also censored and deleted part of the text (regarding where the sender is located). Usage is May 1942 to February 1943, with 4 numbers in the range 7 to 26.



Naval post station 1132, 5.6.1943 to Altai krai, Russian republic, censored at BMΠC #1132 (Novorossisk), 1st period. Usage is March 1942; this is a very rare censor cancel (two recorded usages).

In October 1942 the naval post station was renamed to field post station with the same numbers.



Naval post station 1132, 26.9.1942 to Moscow, Russian republic, censored at BMIIC #1132 (Novorossisk), 2nd period. Naval post station 1132 was assigned to the Black Sea Fleet and was located in Novorossisk. Usage is June to November 1942, with only one number recorded.



Field post station 1133, 5.12.1942 to Moscow, Russian republic, censored at BMIIC #1133 (Poti), 2nd period. Field post station 1133 was assigned to the Black Sea Fleet and was located in Poti. Usage is June to December 1942, with 2 numbers in the range 3 to 5.



Naval post station 1135, 13.9.1941 to Stalin oblast censored at BMIIC #1135 (Kertch, Black Sea Fleet), 1st period. Naval post station 1135 belongs to Black Sea Fleet stationed in Kertch, later it was moved to Poti. Usage is August and September 1941, with 3 numbers in the range 1 to 3. This is a very rare censor cancel, and the *only triangular shaped censor cancel* used by the USSR during the war. The triangular cancels are usually postage free cancels. It is always together with the wavy irregular censor cancel.

1139 - Kertch



Naval post station 1138, 23.9.1942 to Saratov oblast, Russian republic, censored at BM Π C #1138 (Sarabuz), 2^{nd} period. Naval post station 1138 belongs to the Black See Fleet and was located in Sarabuz, and π/π (mailbox) 82 belonged to the naval 12^{th} airbase.

Usage is September 1942 to April 1943, with two numbers in the range 3 to 4.



Naval post station 1139, 14.6.1942 to Voronezh oblast, Russian republic, censored at BMIIC #1139 (Kertch), 2nd period. Naval post station 1139 belongs to the Black See Fleet and was located in Kertch. Usage is May to June 1942, with two numbers in the range 1 to 4.



Field post station 1180, 5.5.1943 to Baskiriya, Russian republic, censored at BMΠC #1180 (Yeisk), 2nd period. Naval post station 1180 belongs to the Azov flotilla and was located in Yeisk.

This is the only recorded usage of this censor cancel.

Naval post station 1154, Baku, no date to Tashkent, Uzbekistan republic, censored at BMIIC #1154 (Baku), 1st period. Naval post station 1154 belongs to the Caspian Sea Fleet and was located in Baku. Usage is December 1941 to July 1942, with 3 numbers in the range 1 to 3. This is a very rare naval postal station and censor cancel.



Field post station 1117, 21.4.1943 to Yaroslavl oblast, Russian republic, censored at BM Π C #1117 (Slavyanka Bay), 2^{nd} period.

Naval post station 1117 belongs to the Pacific Fleet and was located in Slavyanka Bay in Primorskaya krai. Usage is January to April 1943, with only one number recorded.



Naval post station 1118 (Pacific Fleet) 5.6.1943 to Gorky, Russian republic, censored at BMΠC #1118 (Russky Island, Primorsky krai), 2nd period.

Naval post station 1118 belongs to the Pacific Fleet and was located in Russky Island in Primorskaya krai. Usage is July 1942 to June 1943, with 4 numbers in the range 2 to 8.



Field post number 49279, 5.6.1943 to Moscow oblast, Russian republic, censored at BMIIC #1120 (Romanovka), 2nd period. Field post number 49279 is not known. This cover is one of two covers from the same person, three months earlier his address was field post station 1120 (same as censor place). So, field post number 49279 is BMIIC #1120. Field post station 1120 was assigned to the Pacific Fleet and was located in Romanovka, Primorskaya krai. Usage is March to June 1943, with only one

registered number.



Field post station 1121, unclear date 1942 to Gorky, Russian republic, censored at BMΠC #1121 (Village Krim), 2nd period. Field post station 1121 was assigned to the Pacific Fleet and was located in Village Krim, Primorskaya krai. This is the only recorded usage of this censor cancel.

Field post station (ΠΠC) 862, 10.7.1942 to Leningrad, Russian republic, censored at BΠE IO (14th Army), 2nd period. ΠΠC 862 belongs to 26th Rifle Division NKVD, Karelian Front. It is two different types, usage is May 1942 to April 1943, with 13 numbers in the range 3 to 24.



Field post station (ΠΠC) 550, 28.10.1942 to Murmansk oblast, Russian republic, censored at BΠE IO (14th Army), 2nd period. ΠΠC 550 belongs to 258th Fighter Aviation Division, 7th Air Force, Karelian Front. BΠE IO (2nd period) is registered sent from these field post stations: 401, 439, 500, 548, 550, 669




Field post station (ΠΠC) 490, 5.3.1943 to Saratov oblast, Russian republic, censored at BΠE BK (26th Army), 2nd period. ΠΠC 490 belongs to Staff 26th Army, Karelian Front, sent through field post base (BΠE) BK, field post base cancels are rare. It is two different types, usage is April 1942 to March 1943, with 9 numbers in the range 2 to 36. BΠΕ BK (2nd period) is registered sent from these field post stations: 192, 490, 914, 938, 979, 1483.



Field post number (ΠΠΗ) 28564, 24.2.1943 to Zelezhodolsk, Tatar republic, censored at BΠΕ BT (32nd Army), 2nd period. ΠΠΗ 28564 belongs to 80th Separate Marine Brigade, 32nd Army, Karelian Front. It is two different types, usage is June 1942 to April 1943, with 5 numbers in the range 2 to 26. BΠΕ BT (2nd period) is registered sent from these field post stations: 716, 738, 804, 811

Field post number (ΠΠΗ) 26410, 24.2.1943 to Vologda oblast, Russian republic, censored at BΠΕ BC (7th Army), 2nd period. ΠΠΗ 26410 belongs to 2nd Separate Infantry Battalion, 69th Separate Marine Brigade. It is two different types, usage is May 1942 to June 1943, with 14 numbers in the range 6 to 43. BΠΕ BC (2nd period) is registered sent from these field post stations: 130, 194, 475, 617, 1424, 1886, 2048.



Field post station (ΠΠC) 1444, 5.3.1943 to Yaroslavl oblast, censored at BΠE ET (59th Army), 2nd period. ΠΠC 1444 belongs to 377th Infantry Division, 59th Army, Volkhov Front. Usage is December 1942 to March 1943, with 3 numbers in the range 3 to 34. ΒΠΕ ET (2nd period) is registered sent from these field post stations: 804, 1444.

3.3 Censor at B Π B III – 23rd Army





23rd Army (ВПБ Ш)

Field post base III, 22.11.1941 to Leningrad, Russian republic, censored at BΠΕ III (23rd Army), 1st period. BΠΕ III belongs to 23rd Army, which fought in the battle of Leningrad, on the Vyborg side. Usage is observed in November 1941, with the number: 440 Field post cancels from field post bases (BΠΕ) are rare.



Field post station (ППС) 295, 27.2.1942 to Leningrad, Russian republic, censored at BПБ III (23rd Army), 2nd period. ППС 295 belongs to 291st Infantry Division, 23rd Army, this unit fought in the battle of Leningrad, on the Vyborg side. It is three different types, usage is March 1942 to February 1943, with 17 numbers in the range 1 to 42. ВПБ III (2nd period) is registered sent from these field post stations: 434, 470, 524, 951, 998, 1989, 2236, 2241, 2373.



42nd Army (ВПБ АЦ) 55th Army (ВПБ АО)

Postage is 60 kopek (correct was postcard 20 kop. + registered 30 kop.). The postcard is sent 8.8 and arrived 17.8, usually the mail spent 3-4 weeks when it was transported out of the blockade over Lake Ladoga. If it was sent by airmail it took approximately 1 week. The airmail fee was 60 kopek in the period 1st Sep. 1940 -15th Sep. 1948.

Registered field post station (ΠΠC) 699, 8.8.1942 to Ivanovo, Russian republic, censored at BΠΕ ΑЦ (42nd Army), 2nd period. ΠΠC 699 belongs to Staff 42nd Army, Leningrad Front. It is two different types, usage is March 1942 to April 1943, with 39 numbers in the range 3 to 50. BΠΕ ΑЦ (2nd period) is registered sent from these field post stations: 145, 187, 245, 394, 436, 448, 455, 468, 551, 557, 620, 699, 753, 995, 996, 1405, 1813, 2037, 2189, 2241.



Field post number (ΠΠΗ) 67616, arrival date 5.4.1943 Leningrad, Russian republic, censored at BΠΕ AO (55th Army), 2nd period. ΠΠC 67616 belongs to 134th Infantry Regiment, 45th Infantry Division, 55th Army, Leningrad Front.

It is four different types usage is April 1942 to April 1942, with more than 20 mumbers in the same 2 to 50.

It is four different types, usage is April 1942 to April 1943, with more than 29 numbers in the range 3 to 50. This type of the cancel is only observed with the number 37.

BIIE AO (2nd period) is registered sent from these field post stations: 366, 494, 506, 856, 857, 937, 996, 1713, 2289



Registered field post station (ΠΠC) 506, 4.12.1942 to ΠΠC 15, censored at BΠB AO (55th Army), 2nd period. ΠΠC 506 belongs to 55th Army staff, Leningrad Front, and ΠΠC 15 belongs to 109th Infantry Division, 42nd Army, Leningrad Front. It is usually only letters connected to the Leningrad Front that has cancel from the censorship in the content itself. It is four different types, usage is April 1942 to April 1943, with more than 29 numbers in the range 3 to 50. Date cancels on the backside from the VPSP #2 (ΒΠCΠ Leningrad Front) and ΠΠC 15, front to front field post is rare. Postage is 60 kopek (letter 30 kop. + reg. fee 30 kop.) in the period 6th February 1939 to 15th September 1948.



Field post station (ΠΠC) 4, 8.1.1943 to Omsk, Russian republic, censored at ΒΠБ ΓД (67th Army), 2nd period. ΠΠC 4 belongs to Nevsky Operative Group, Staff 67th Army, Leningrad Front. Usage is November 1942 to March 1943, with 22 numbers in the range 3 to 50. ΒΠБ ΓД (2nd period) is registered sent from these field post stations: 4, 121, 366, 436, 857, 937, 1768, 1980, 2241.



Field post station (ППС) 418, 2.1.1943 to Gorky oblast, Russian republic, censored at BПБ AK (8th Army), 2nd period. ППС 418 belongs to 5th Leningrad rifle division of the national militia/80th Infantry Division, 8th Army, Volkhov Front. It is two different types, usage is April 1942 to April 1943, with 24 numbers in the range 3 to 47. BПБ AK (2nd period) is registered sent from these field post stations: 54, 341, 347, 418, 491, 591, 621, 828, 992, 1426.



Field post station (ΠΠC) 99, 27.1.1943 to Moscow, Russian republic, censored at BΠΕ AU (52nd Army), 2nd period. ΠΠC 99 belongs to 225th rifle division (2nd formation), Volkhov Front.

It is three different types, usage is April 1942 to March 1943, with 5 numbers in the range 5 to 37.

BΠΕ AU (2nd period) is registered sent from these field post stations: 99, 990, 1482



Field post station (ΠΠC) 1634, 28.3.1943 to Gorky oblast, Russian republic, censored at BΠE Д (11th Army), 2nd period. ΠΠC 1634 belongs to 159th rifle division (3rd formation), North-western Front. It is three different types, usage is April 1942 to May 1943, with 13 numbers in the range 7 to 33. ВПБ Д (2nd period) is registered sent from these field post stations: 634, 839, 840, 883, 1476, 1604, 1634, 1693
